Every Plane Has a Story

The mechanic who serviced Amelia Earhart's plane watched as artist Gary Stone painted a Travelair back-country plane on the ceiling at the Twin Falls airport. Earhart's plane was a similar design. While getting her plane ready for flight one day, he taped a nickel coin to the floorboard for good luck. Earhart was to return the coin upon arrival home, which she never did. Her crash and disappearance remain a sought-after mystery to this day. He jokingly wondered if the coin had caused her plane to be over-weight and crash.

That is just one of many, many stories Stone has heard over the years he has been painting on that huge mural. Every airplane pictured has ties to our local airport, either landing here or crewed by a local person. Their names are hidden on their plane.

Gary Stone's personal ties to aviation go back to 1961 when he was hired by West Coast Airlines in Boise, and where he was employed while the airline changed names several times until he left to become a full-time professional artist. Several of those years were spent at Twin Falls and Hailey airports, so he was well aware that people waiting in airports have spare time with little to do. It seemed a natural place for an enjoyable, educational piece of art. And the mural has become its own attraction as students, residents and travelers go to the airport just to marvel at what they see, and to look for the many hidden faces and names.

If you catch Gary painting at the airport, he will gladly give you a personal tour of the mural, showing many of the features not normally observed by the viewer, such as attorney Harry Turner's name written in Braille. Or all the foreign names on the "Chinese Tree," including the Chinese Ambassador's, who made a special trip (complete with U.S. Secret Service agents) to the airport just to watch Gary paint his name. The Secret Service didn't see him do it. They were watching everyone else.





There's a "Russian" tree too. They were here on a trade mission as well. Many other countries are represented. They all consider it a rare honor to be included in American art.

The B-24 pictured on the ceiling was shot down in WWll. The wing was shot off and the crew bailed out. The Captain rode the plane down. The last man to bail out was the tail-gunner, who broke his leg on impact. He managed to crawl into a nearby haystack to hide. Several days later, German troops coming down the nearby road, came under attack by Allied planes. Several scurried into the same haystack. The injured airman was taken prisoner and spent the rest of the war in a Stalag. (German prisoner of war camp)

Joslin Field is named for a local man, a tail-gunner in the pictured B-17, who died when his plane was shot down in WWII. He was one of the first casualties from Idaho, but certainly not the last.

Every person who sacrifices his life for his fellow man deserves special recognition. Heroes should never be forgotten.

Because Gary Stone feels so strongly about that, he decided to make Fallen Heroes the subject of the addition

to the existing mural. When he was approached about "going around the corner" he pondered what part of Idaho history to feature. About that time, Idaho lost a hero who was related to Gary and the problem was solved.

He requested and received permission to create a Memorial to those who have made sacrifices for Freedom in the Afghanistan and Iraq conflicts. The Military has provided a list of those who have died in action to date. If there are more casualties, they will be included until those conflicts cease. Since it is his personal work, Gary Stone has decided to add the names of the injured as well. If you have the name of an injured soldier, feel free to contact Gary Stone at 539-4355. There is no fee to include their names.

The Memorial project already has a good start, and is mounted on the wall at the Twin Falls airport. It features Idaho scenery, the United States and Idaho flags, and a huge campfire representing the Home Fires we should keep burning for our soldiers. Gary Stone will be painting the detail, hoping for a finish, except for future names, by Veteran's Day.

As he continues to paint on this one-of-a-kind piece of art, there will be many more stories told that will become part of our Idaho history. It will be worth your time to go take a look.

Necktie Party in Boise By Bev Stone © 1983

uring the spring and summer of 1864, the Boise Basin received an influx of residents from the Lewiston and Florence mining areas. Many of them were members of an outlaw gang organized by Henry Plummer, and four of whom were hanged in Lewiston for the murder of Lloyd Magruder. Those good citizens, fed up with lawlessness, had demanded that the rest leave the area or risk more "necktie parties."

Plummer himself headed for Montana, while his lieutenants continued their plunder of other Idaho mining camps, much of it under the guise of the law, as the indifference of the good citizens, coupled with those who were "agin the government," had the result of placing the law into the hands of the lawless element.

Citizens, who would make conscientious jurors, shirked that duty with the result that those hanging around the courtrooms (often members of the gangs) were appointed jurors by the sheriff. In the case of a murder trial, such jurors would not convict the accused no matter what the evidence might be. No conviction for murder was secured during the first term of the District Court held in Boise.

Elections in the fall of 1864 provided for selecting county officers, including members of the second session of the territorial legislature and a delegate to Congress.

Few of the business people paid much, if any, attention to the primaries or nominating conventions, but the "saloon interests" did. To protect their patrons, including gamblers, highwaymen (known as roadsters") and other members of the underworld, they saw to it that nominees were chosen who would not be detrimental to their business.

The second session of the Idaho Territorial Legislature, November 11, 1864, designated Boise City as the permanent capitol of Idaho Territory as well as the county seat of the new Ada County.

During the summer of 1865, one of the farmers in the area claimed his horse had been stolen. At the hearing, all those called to the stand testified against the farmer except a young man named Raymond who testified on the farmer's behalf.

After he left the courtroom, the boy was stopped by a group of men on Main Street, one of who called him a liar and slapped him in the face. The boy stepped up on the sidewalk with his back against the wall and drew his gun. One of the other men in the group, John Clark, yelled at him to shoot.

The boy declined, saying he didn't want to shoot anyone, but wouldn't permit anyone to beat him up. He dropped his gun.

Then Clark drew his gun and shot the boy who fell to the ground fatally wounded but still able to speak. His first words were, "I did not draw on Johnnie Clark, did I?" and someone answered, "No." He then said, "I hate to be shot like a dog for telling the truth." "It was unanimously agreed that Clark was guilty and should be hanged."

Dr. Ephraim Smith examined the wound, turned to the gathering crowd and declared, "Gentlemen, this is a dastardly outrage!" as the boy died.

Dave Updyke, an ex-sheriff and one of the "boys," took the doctor aside telling him to keep still, saying, "This is only the beginning."

Clark was immediately taken to the office of the Justice of the Peace, where a trial took place. The witnesses testified that Raymond drew first and Clark shot in self-defense. Nothing was said about the other man who slapped Raymond and nothing was said about Raymond declining to shoot. Nothing was said about Johnny Clark shooting without warning from the side.

Public feeling and outrage rose to such a fever pitch, the Judge, certain an acquittal would result in the hanging of Clark, delayed his decision and ordered the confinement of Clark in Fort Boise barracks rather than the city jail, placing him under military guard.

As evening approached, it appeared the excitement had died down. Few people were on the streets. Business leaders gathered together to discuss the situation in secrecy. They had finally realized the "saloon interests" were in control of the city.

It was unanimously agreed that Clark was guilty and should be hanged. They determined to do it themselves, arranging for the Sergeant of the Guard at Boise Barracks to give up his prisoner without violence.

The sergeant, not wanting one of his own men captured at his post, gave the guard duty to a volunteer who had been left behind when his unit passed through Boise several days earlier.

At the appointed time, the guard was jumped, disarmed, tied and gagged. Clark was captured without firing a shot, dragged from his cell and placed on a horse. The group headed west.

The sentry, meanwhile, had managed to untie his hands and shot at the fleeing riders. On hearing gunfire, a general alarm was sounded. The troop was gathered and ordered out. The raiders had a long head start and pursuit in darkness proved futile. The search was called off to be resumed in the morning when the trail would be easily followed.

When morning dawned, the search resumed. They hadn't gone far when they discovered the body of John Clark hanging by the neck from a triangle erected on the ground later occupied by the Idaho State Capitol building.
